**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BLUE ISLAND, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS,
AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BY
AND BETWEEN THE CITY AND VARIOUS MUNICIPALITIES REGARDING THE
2023 JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the City of Blue Island, Cook County, Illinois (the “*City*”) is a duly organized and existing City created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefits of the residents of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*, (the “*Act*”) authorizes units of local government to exercise jointly with any public agency of the State, including other units of local government, any power, privilege or authority which may be exercised by a unit of local government individually, and to enter into contracts for the performance of governmental services, activities or undertakings; and

WHEREAS, the City and the various municipalities desire to execute an intergovernmental agreement regarding the 2023 Justice Assistance Grant Program (“*JAG*”), a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, as Exhibit A (the “*Agreement*”); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Aldermen of the City deem it advisable and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City to enter into the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the Aldermen of the City of Blue Island, Cook County, Illinois as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their

entirety.

Section 2. The Agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A, is hereby approved in substantially the same form presented to the Mayor and Aldermen with such necessary non-material changes as may be authorized by the Mayor and City Attorney to execute the Agreement, the execution of which constitutes the approval by the City of any and all changes or revisions therein contained.

Section 3. The officials and officers of the City are hereby authorized to undertake actions on the part of the City as contained in the Agreement to complete satisfaction of the provisions, terms or conditions stated therein.

Section 4. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Resolution.

Section 5. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.



INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

FY 2023 JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) PROGRAM AWARD

BY AND AMONG CITY OF CHICAGO, the COUNTY of COOK, VILLAGE OF BELLWOOD, CITY OF BERWYN, CITY OF BLUE ISLAND, CITY OF CALUMET CITY, VILLAGE OF CALUMET PARK, CITY OF CHICAGO HEIGHTS, TOWN OF CICERO, CITY OF EVANSTON, CITY OF HARVEY, CITY OF MARKHAM, VILLAGE OF MATTESON, VILLAGE OF MAYWOOD, VILLAGE OF OAK PARK, VILLAGE OF SKOKIE, AND THE VILLAGE OF SAUK VILLAGE.

This Intergovernmental Agreement (“IGA”) is made and entered into as of _____, 2023, by and among the City of Chicago (“Chicago”), a municipal corporation and home rule unit of government under Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, by and through its Department of Police (“CPD”), and the County of Cook, Village of Bellwood, City of Berwyn, City of Blue Island, City of Calumet City, Village of Calumet Park, City of Chicago Heights, Town of Cicero, City of Evanston, City of Harvey, City of Markham, Village of Matteson, Village of Maywood, Village of Oak Park, Village of Skokie, and the Village of Sauk Village, (each (except for Chicago), a “Governing Body”).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Justice Assistance (“BJA”) of the Office of Justice Programs (“OJP”) of the United States Department of Justice supports law enforcement programs, court and corrections programs, drug treatment, victim assistance services, and the upgrading of technology in connection with prevention initiatives that strengthen the nation's criminal justice system; and

WHEREAS, the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (“JAG”) Program (the “Program”) is administered by the BJA and provides funding that supports states, tribes and local governments in a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime based on their own local needs and conditions; and

WHEREAS, jurisdictions identified by BJA as “disparate” under the Program must identify a fiscal agent local unit of government that will submit a joint application for the aggregate eligible allocation to all disparate municipalities and local governments, specifying the award distribution that would be made to each disparate entity; and

WHEREAS, if a Program award is made to such fiscal agent, said entity will undertake to distribute the correct allocation of award funds to each disparate entity through subawards that include all appropriate award conditions; and

WHEREAS, Chicago has agreed to serve as the fiscal agent municipality for the FY 2023 Program for this jurisdiction and to undertake the required distributions by subaward to each disparate entity; and

WHEREAS, each Governing Body is a disparate entity for purposes of the FY 2023 Program for this jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, Chicago and each Governing Body must establish separate trust funds in which to deposit their respective JAG funds, and

WHEREAS, Chicago and each Governing Body desire to enter into this IGA to provide for the responsibilities and obligation of the parties hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Chicago Superintendent of Police is authorized to enter into this IGA by Section 8 of the 2023 Annual Appropriation Ordinance that was enacted by the City Council of the City of Chicago on October 3, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the signatory party for each respective Governing Body hereunder affirms that he or she is authorized to enter into this IGA by an ordinance or similar enactment by such Governing Body;

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agrees as follows:

ARTICLE ONE: INCORPORATION OF RECITALS

The recital set forth above are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof.

ARTICLE TWO: PROGRAM ALLOCATIONS

SECTION 1. In its fiscal agent role hereunder, Chicago has received or will be receiving an award of JAG Program funding from the BJA in the amount of \$2,652,976.00 (“Aggregate Funding”), of which Chicago's allocation will be \$1,851,569 (“Chicago Allocation”).

SECTION 2. In its role as fiscal agent, Chicago will allocate the entirety of the Aggregate Funding, less the amount of Chicago Allocation, as follows, and each Governing Body agrees to accept its stated allocation:

SECTION 3. Nothing in this IGA shall impose any liability upon any party to this IGA other than liability that may be imposed under law.

SECTION 4. Each party to this IGA will be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this IGA and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of services by the other parties.

SECTION 5. The parties to this IGA do not intend any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this IGA.

SECTION 6. By entering into this IGA, the parties hereto do not intend to create any obligations other than those set out herein.

SECTION 7. Each party hereto will observe its respective rights and obligations under the JAG Program solicitation document set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto.

ARTICLE THREE: TERM

The term of this IGA shall commence on the date of its execution and shall expire when BJA provides a final close-out notice for the FY 2023 grant or on September 30, 2026, whichever may occur later.

ARTICLE FOUR: TRUST FUNDS

Each Governing Body will establish an individual Trust Fund for its respective JAG funds pursuant to the JAG guidelines. Chicago will deposit its Chicago Allocation of JAG funds, including \$179,040.00 thereof specifically to be used for administrative purposes, into an interest-bearing account.

ARTICLE FIVE: CONSENT

All parties to this IGA agree and consent to Chicago being the fiscal agent for the Program. Each Governing Body agrees to provide the City of Chicago required documentation to the City as set forth in Exhibit B in a timely manner.

ARTICLE SIX: REPORTS

Each Governing Body shall submit to CPD the quarterly and semi-annual performance and quarterly fiscal reports required under the Program for the periods of January through March, April through June, July through September and October through December. Each quarterly or semi-annual report shall be due 15 days after each quarter ends each year.

ARTICLE EIGHT: MODIFICATION

This IGA may not be altered, modified or amended except by written instrument signed by all of the parties hereto.

ARTICLE NINE: COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The parties hereto shall comply with all with all federal, state and municipal laws, ordinances, rule and regulations that may pertain to the IGA.

ARTICLE TEN: GOVERNING LAW AND SEVERABILITY

This IGA shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois. The invalidity of any one or more phrases, sentences, clauses or sections contained in this IGA shall not affect the remaining portions of this IGA.

ARTICLE ELEVEN: COUNTERPARTS

This IGA may be executed in counterparts.

ARTICLE TWELVE: ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This IGA constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and shall supersede any and all prior agreements regarding the subject matter.

ARTICLE THIRTEEN: HEADINGS

The headings and titles of this IGA are for convenience only and shall not influence the construction or interpretation of this IGA.

ARTICLE FOURTEEN: DISCLAIMER OF RELATIONSHIP

Nothing contained in this IGA, nor any act of the parties, shall be deemed or construed by any of the parties hereto or by third persons to create any relationship of third party beneficiary, limited or general partnership or joint venture with or among the parties.

ARTICLE FIFTEEN: NO PERSONAL LIABILITY

No member, official, employee or agent of any of the parties to this IGA shall be individually or personally liable in connection with this IGA.

ARTICLE SIXTEEN: REPRESENTATIVES
