I. Mayor's Announcements/Comments.

The Mayor reported that there was a small tornado. He stated that this City Counsel and administration reviewed the systems and reactivated the emergency sirens upon entering office. Unfortunately, two of the sirens are damaged and must be replaced. The Mayor discussed applying for available grant funds for the cost of this issue. Alderman Fahrenwald commended the Neighborhood Watch Group for bringing this issue to the City's attention.

The Mayor informed the Council that Tree City USA is coming to the City to highlight the Forestry Board's successful tree planting program, which was established and reinstituted during the last two decades thanks to Valarie Kehoe's efforts.

The Mayor stated that the City sent out lead surveys and clarified that the survey is requesting pictures and answers to questions on the website and Facebook. The goal is to determine what information is known and the cost of lead pipe(s) in order for the City to obtain low-interest loans for the replacement.

The Mayor stated that the Mayor of Evergreen Park, who was an attorney during the last administration, is spearheading a campaign to obtain financial assistance through Springfield. The Mayor further stated that Blue Island has an aging infrastructure, so the Mayor of Evergreen Park is obtaining data from Burke Engineering for more information.

The Mayor announced that the City has been awarded \$40,000 in CDBG grants for the northeast sections of streets as well as the 119<sup>th</sup> and Irving program for next year.

The Mayor notified the City that there are twenty vacant homes, seven of which require emergency demolition and cannot be salvaged, and that a grant received earlier in the year will be used for demolition costs.

The Mayor indicated that Forest View has received an encouraging report on mobile homes, which would be discussed during executive session.

The Mayor indicated that Green Alleyways has been approved, with one that will be completed next spring located on the northwest corner of Central and 123<sup>rd</sup>.

The Mayor announced that the City received one of the four plow trucks that were purchased three and a half years ago. Jim Poelsterl was helpful in urging the City to promptly purchase the plow trucks by providing information that the trucks would not be received immediately.

The Mayor stated that although the Police and Fire Departments need full-time employees, it is manageable and being addressed. The City is conducting a survey on how nearby communities encourage applicants.

The Mayor stated that the City received a \$120,000 grant from the DCEO.
