City Administrator, Thomas Wogan, reported that the pathway for 2025 would focus on the City's investment in public infrastructure, including the water main lines and water treatment tanks. He noted that this would require an outside source of funding; and so the City would be looking into grants, interest forgivable loans, and bonding.

Alderman Fahrenwald stated that the general appropriation for property is \$3.4 million and the general revenue fund is \$25.6 million. He noted that all property owners are paying a lot in property taxes; however, the amount is small compared to the 13% of the overall general budget. We emphasize that the City is not the main culprit for paying high taxes.

City Administrator, Thomas Wogan, stated that 60 cents of every dollar of property tax goes to the city, while 40% goes to other municipal entities like the library and school districts. The general fund is responsible for the city's operations, and the City spend the majority of its time ensuring that revenues and expenditures are as close as possible in the general fund.
